During her time at UBCM, Errin was the lead staff person charged with gathering and providing the Public Library Services Branch with feedback from local governments on the 2004 Strategic Plan for Public Libraries, along with coordinating UBCM's annual resolutions process, managing the organization's information resources and providing general reference services to UBCM members.

Errin brings with her a strong interest in policy and advocacy work, a good knowledge of the local, provincial and federal government scene, and a passion for public libraries. She looks forward to serving library trustees around the province in her new capacity with BCLTA - and welcomes input from the membership as to how best to address member needs and concerns. As a trained librarian, Errin also welcomes all questions and queries from members and others, and vows to do her best to find answers and provide assistance whenever needed. Errin attended McGill University and the University of Victoria in addition to Dalhousie, and grew up in various small, mid-sized and large communities throughout BC. She taught English in Japan for a year before going into Library Studies, and worked in the forest industry for several years before that, as well as in editing and libraries. She and her husband, Grant Morrison, recently moved to Port Moody and are anticipating the birth of their first child in mid-February.
